RESOLUTION NO. 3592, S-2025

**A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE MANDALUYONG
10-YEAR SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT
PLAN (SWMP) 2025-2034**

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code (LGC) provides that every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare;

WHEREAS, Section 22 of the LGC, likewise, provides that every local government unit, as a corporation, shall have the power to enter into contracts, convey real properties, as well as exercise such other powers as are granted to corporations;

WHEREAS, local government units are mandated to ensure and support, among other things, promote health and safety and enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9003 or the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000 was enacted to provide for a defined mechanism for efficient management of waste across the country, all focused on, among others, the disposal, diversion, and treatment of waste products for the protection of public health and the environment;

WHEREAS, through the introduction of traditional and novel interventions, a systematic approach on the maximization of resources while promoting conservation and recovery is sought, with stakeholders being expected to take part in achieving the objectives of the National Solid Waste Management Framework to be set out by the National Government;

WHEREAS, as a major player in the Framework, participation of local government units in the implementation of said Framework is crucial, as they are primarily responsible for the implementation and enforcement of the provisions of the law within their respective jurisdictions, including but not limited to identification of common solid waste management problems, establishment of common waste treatment and disposal facilities, segregation and collection of solid waste, evaluation of mandatory segregation programs, establishment of a Material Recovery Facility, and implementation of information dissemination activities for the benefit of their respective constituents;

WHEREAS, one of the more defined responsibilities of local government units is the preparation of their respective 10-year solid waste management plans, with mandatory review and updating on a yearly basis, consistent with the national solid waste management framework for the reuse, recycling and composting of wastes generated in their respective jurisdictions;

WHEREAS, it is necessary that the aforesaid plan contains all the components mandated by the law and a timetable for the implementation of the solid waste management program and ensures the efficient management of solid waste generated within their respective jurisdictions, placing primary emphasis on implementation of all feasible reuse, recycling, and composting programs while identifying the amount of landfill and transformation capacity that will be needed for solid waste which cannot be reused, recycled, or composted;

WHEREAS, among the particular components required by law to be included in the plan are the waste characterization component, collection and transfer plan, waste processing methods and systems, source reduction component, recycling component, composting component, solid waste facility component, public information component, special waste component, funding component, measures for the promotion and participation of the private sector, and incentive programs;

WHEREAS, the City of Mandaluyong, as a premier local government unit in the National Capital Region and despite its ever-growing population, boasts established programs geared towards an efficient and effective solid waste management system and environmental safety and protection;

WHEREAS, aiming a waste diversion target of 68.73% sourced from the results of its Waste Analysis and Characterization Study (WACS), the City, through its City Environmental Management Department, all of its twenty-seven (27) barangays, and concerned national government agencies and non-governmental organizations, arrived at a proposed Mandaluyong 10-Year Solid Waste Management Plan (SWMP) 2025-2034, which contains necessary long-term solid waste interventions to be undertaken by the City for the next ten (10) years;

WHEREAS, upon the review and assessment of the Sangguniang Panlungsod and the conduct of the necessary hearing with all relevant stakeholders, the Plan is substantially compliant with the requirements set forth by relevant national and local legislations, rules, and regulations;


WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlungsod intends to adopt the proposed Mandaluyong 10-Year Solid Waste Management Plan (SWMP) 2025-2034 which will serve as the City's guide in the implementation of its solid waste programs, strategies, and initiatives.

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion duly seconded, the Sangguniang Panlungsod of Mandaluyong, in session assembled, RESOLVED, as it hereby RESOLVES, to adopt the Mandaluyong 10-Year Solid Waste Management Plan (SWMP) 2025-2034.


